Ten people took advantage of the Trike course and four participated in the trailer class. This represents a much greater turnout than in 2005. Besides the rider courses, more than a dozen people took the Road Captain class and several dozen of our friends participated in the Co-Rider, Mature Rider, Crash Scene Response, and Be Prepared seminars. The single fly in the ointment was that nobody signed up for the Medic First-Aid course. This was surprising in light of the frustrated demand at the rally two years ago. This situation may be a reflection of the efforts to conduct more classes throughout the year or perhaps a natural reluctance to take a class which use up an entire day at the rally.

Rider Education also held some fun events at the rally. Throughout the weekend we sold tickets for a set of Dunlop motorcycle tires. The winner was drawn at the banquet on Saturday night. The lucky winner was Joyce Stout of Chapter F. On Saturday afternoon we held our NASACAR Slot Car races. A field of 24 contestants (owners) raced for cash prizes. This time Dave Perry did NOT win! The first place went to Charlie Fedeli, second place went to Joe Wheeler, and third place went to Carol Daley.

All monies raised at the rally went toward the Rider Course Rebate Program and with slightly over \$200 raised, we are offering four lucky raffle winners. If the winners, or a family member, take one of several training courses within the next year, they are eligible for as much as a \$50 rebate towards the cost of the course. I congratulate the winners and urge them to take advantage of the program.

Finally it was my honor to present the 2007 NY District Rider Educator of the Year award to Tony & Michelle van Schaick. Tony and Michelle have always been willing to help everyone in Rider Education in any capacity whenever they have been asked. They currently hold something like four different positions in Rider Education from the International, Region, and even the Chapter levels. The award is a very small token of appreciation for the work they have done in Rider Education for the District and the entire organization.

As an added note, in Illinois, GWRRA Chapter G2 was the top club with contributing \$89,468. Congratulations on a job well done.

One of the biggest fears of touring motorcyclists is becoming injured or ill many miles from home. One of the great things about GWRRA is the willingness of its members to help each other in time of need. Twice this summer participants of Chapter NY-W were there at such a time.

On July 26 Jerry & Terri Lovgren and Ken & Linda Beal were passing thru Brockport, NY. The Hinckley, Minnesota residents were headed home from a trip to Nova Scotia. At 1PM at the intersection of Rt. 104 and Sweden-Walker Rd. the Lovgrens had an accident with a pickup truck. Chapter W participant Kathy Jordan heard the impact from a nearby restaurant, and immediately ran to the scene. She exchanged information with the Minnesotans. That evening Jim & Kathy Jordan and Rick & Bonnie Rowles visited the Lovgrens at Strong Memorial Hospital in Rochester. The Jordan's and the Rowles provided housing and hospitality for the Beal's who stayed for 2 days before heading home. Jerry Lovgren had sustained fewer injuries than his wife Terri. He also enjoyed the hospitality of the Jordan's and Rowles. Terri was badly injured, and went through surgery to remove her ruptured spleen. She was hospitalized for 5 days.

Since his Gold Wing was totaled, Jerry needed transportation to and from the hospital to visit his wife. The Jordan's and Rowles provided this service as well. When they were unable, Bill Kleisle was there to help. Jerry flew home on August 1. Terry was released from the hospital on the same day. Her sister flew to Rochester and drove her home.

During our NY District Rally a couple from Chapter NJ-D had a health emergency. Althea Farrell developed severe pneumonia and was admitted to the hospital in Newark, NY. Her husband Hugh stayed with her, and ran short of money. He needed a place to stay, so he called some of GWRRA friends in NJ, who called NY District Director Dottie Bahrenburg. She made a few phone calls to Chapter NY W. Eventually Jim and Linda Pearson were called. They live about 20 minutes from Newark and took Hugh into their home. Hugh would spend the nights in the Pearson's home, have breakfast with them, and then visit Althea in the hospital until late evening. The hospital staff was so impressed with this display of GWRRA hospitality that they referred to Linda as the "Chapter Lady". After a few days, Althea started to recover. This enabled Hugh to attend our August Gathering, where he won several door prizes and made some new friends. Althea has since recovered and they are back home in NJ.

If any of us suffer such unfortunate circumstances, may we find such kind people to help.

Area Report Changes

We are making some changes to the reports you get monthly to help make things easier for

everybody. We will no longer be sending out a full Area Report. In many cases it made things more difficult when trying to figure out what was what. We will now send out a New Member listing, Expiring Member listing and a listing of Prospective Members. We anticipate that this will make things easier and expedite contacting people to participate in the local activities. We also want to make things easier for the District Director when trying to decide if a new chapter is needed and where to place it. So, we will be sending out a Zip Code list that will show how many Members are in a specific zip code. This will help the DDs when assigning a zip code for a new chapter Member.

Updates: Some of you may wonder how you are supposed to update your Members' information if you don't receive the full Area Report. Well, effective immediately, we will no longer be accepting any updates to a Member's record from anyone except the Member. We have had many circumstances where the information given to us was the wrong information. The Members must update their own information on line, by phone, email, or snail mail. A few might feel they are being inconvenienced, but we really are trying to make sure their private information is secure and accurate. (Remember all the identity theft problems that have recently become so rampant?)

Here is a letter of explanation from Bill Dodd, GWRRA Recruitment and Retention Coordinator

Greetings everyone,

I hope that all those traveling from Wing Ding have made it home safely. It was very good that I had the pleasure of meeting some of you. I would also like to thank those that helped me man the Recruitment and Retention Table. Without your assistance, we may not have recruited as many new members as we did and it was without a doubt due to your efforts.

During the rally, I have given three seminars and attended one "Meet the International MED Staff" forum. Throughout it all, there was one common theme; the Area Run List (ARL). Some of you have commented on how you can no longer do the job of Recruitment and Retention without this list. You can still perform this task by using your last copy of the Area Run List, the Hot List, New Member and Expiring Members Report, and by creating your own Microsoft Excel spreadsheet.

The Area Run List was never intended to be used as a Chapter Roster. A Chapter Roster is something that the Chapter Director creates for himself from the sign-in sheet. The intention of the Area Report was to let the Chapter Director know what Members lived in his/her geographical area. Also, Chapter Directors could coordinate with members about errors found in the report and make necessary changes back up the chain. While some worked hard at making this list work for them and their members, too many others complained that it was too much work and cumbersome. It's true, the ARL requires a dedicated person to work the list each month. I've put in many hours each month for my district, so I know first hand on how much work is required. It did become one huge headache for the District and many errors would go unreported if the report updates were not done on a monthly basis.

Therefore, it has been decided to not send out the ARL and Chapter Directors are no longer tasked with correcting errors. The new plan is to send out a monthly Hot List, New Member and Expiring Members List. Now the only tasks that Chapter Directors and/or their appointees need to do is contact, either through email or a phone call, any new member that lives in their area and invite them to their meeting. Then, in your working copy, annotate the date and time the new member was contacted for your own personal records. No other work is necessary. If there are errors, then the Member themselves must make the correction, either by a phone call to the Home Office, or on the GWRRA Web Site. Many of you still have your most recent copy of the ARL. I would encourage you to hold on that and use it as your baseline. When you receive your copy of the Hot List, New Member and Expiring Member Report, make yourself a working copy of this list and file the original in a safe place.

Include the members from your old ARL that live in your area so that you can keep track of those members.

Another suggestion that would be very beneficial was for Chapter Directors to create their own Chapter Roster by using Microsoft Excel Spreadsheet. Design it in the same format as your current sign-in sheet, but with members names already entered. But now include a new column for the members to make a check mark by their name indicating two things; one: That they were present at the meeting and, two: That they can see if their info has any errors. This will alleviate members having to fill in the same information each month during a meeting and allow Chapter Directors to see at a glance if a member has missed three or more meetings. He then can initiate a phone call to let the member know they were missed. Also, if the members find any errors in this list, they can contact the Home Office and make a correction. It is also obvious that this list would contain sensitive member information so it must be safeguarded.

You can still perform the job, but with less work involved. I've always said, "work smarter, not harder"! We are trying to make this job easier for everyone and make this work for our members. Breakdowns can still occur and one could be the dissemination of the Hot List, New Member and Expiring Members Report. It is very important for these reports to reach the Chapter Directors and their Recruiter/Membership Enhancement Coordinators so that they can make contact with new and/or expiring members.

Remember, Recruitment and Retention is the lifeblood of our great Association. If there is a break in communication at any level, many Members are affected. In the end, it is our Members who suffer the most. Please help me with this task.
