Instructor Training

The simple fact is that we do not have enough MFA Instructors in Region B! Over the last several years we have experienced a net decrease in our instructor corps. We need to train additional instructors, period! At this time it looks like I'll be conducting a MFA Instructor class at next summer's New England Convention in Lewiston Maine. If we can generate some interest, I am more than willing to hold the same class at next years Winter-Thing, Bi-State Convention (NY-NJ), and the Pennsylvania Convention.

I envision that the seminar portion of the course would be held on the day **before** the actual convention starts. Then, during the convention itself, the new instructors would teach their required proctored course. By holding the seminar a day early, the new instructors will not have to give up their entire convention experience. I am looking for no more than 3 to 5 instructor-students per class. That way each new instructor gets experience in the proctored class. It's important that we try not to get all of them from a single chapter because, remember as instructors, they still must teach a minimum of two classes within two years in order to renew their teaching credentials. Too many instructors within a small geographic area will hinder the compliance with that rule.

So Please ask around and find if there are any members who might want to become GWRRA – MFA instructors and [contact me](#) with their information or have them contact me. I will inform them as to the requirements and will get them in a class.

From the District Educator



The End is Near!

So where am I going this time. Well, I can tell you not off a cliff, but the end of this year's great riding season sure is. I know bad English, but my English teacher

always did have troubles with me. Anyhow here goes my point, let's talk about putting the finishing touches on the season and more importantly our great machines. They deserve the best for the long winter's sleep.

So, let's go over a few key items. First I know there are riders and cleaners. Well, the riding is ending and it's a good time for a very thorough cleaning. First, let's get all the bug dirt off everything. It is so acidic on all surfaces. Next get all the road dirt off. It contains many contaminants for our aluminum frames. Lastly, get all the brake dust off the wheels and calipers. It will pit the rims and freeze with caliper slides.

Next let's clean the inside. At the very end of the season, drain and replace the oil and filter. Next fill the fuel tank with fresh gas and add the required amount of the new stabilizer. The new ethanol in the gas is really bad for our fuel systems. Run the bike for a few minutes with the stabilizer to get it through the entire system.

Next find a good place to store the bike, preferably without any rodents. They can destroy everything on all motor vehicles. Then at least put the bike on the center stand, if not on a lift. Make sure your tires are properly inflated.

Lastly take care of our energizer, the battery. A small battery tender will do wonders. I had my OEM battery last 8 years and only replaced it because I thought it was a smart thing to do. They are cheap insurance.

As some of you may know-my brother, who is a motorcyclist as well, always passes on information to me that is related to motorcycling. Below is an article he received:

From the Motorcycle Riders Foundation:

A letter from [Congressman James Sensenbrenner](#) is being sent to [United States Department of Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood](#) seeking insight into the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's recent request for applications from law enforcement agencies to obtain grant money to hold motorcycle only roadside checkpoints. The letter also asks that the grant process be suspended until sound reasoning for the checkpoints is produced.

NHTSA recently announced that it would solicit applications and then award grants to police units who want to conduct motorcycle only roadside safety checkpoints. The MRF is strongly in opposition to this program.

[Congressman Sensenbrenner](#) is a long time friend of the MRF and ABATE of WI with a history of supporting motorcycle rights on issues such most notably as one of the first to spearhead the repeal of the National mandatory helmet law in 1995. He has also been a staunch advocate for fairness when it comes to health care issues for motorcyclists, as well as an active and vocal supporter for the NHTSA lobby ban. Mr. Sensenbrenner has called on his colleagues to sign a letter of request to the US DOT to gain more information on the motorcycle-only roadside checkpoints and to halt funding until that information is produced.

This approach to stopping the roadside checkpoints got unanimous consent when discussed at the MRF Meeting of the Minds 2010 MRF/State [Motorcycle Right Organization](#) Legislative Strategy Session held last weekend.

Senate safety hearing mentions [motorcycle helmet use](#).

Today, the [Senate Committee on Commerce Science and Transportation](#) held a hearing on the [National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's](#) endeavors. The hearing featured NHTSA Administrator David Strickland. Strickland referenced the overall decline in traffic fatalities from 2004-2009. He also suggested that the rise in seat belt use and child restraint use are contributors to the decline. He then went on to point out the rise in motorcycle fatalities over the same time period.

Strickland's direct quote:

"However, you will notice that there is one indicator that is moving in the wrong direction, motorcycle fatalities. Between 2004 and 2009, the number of motorcycle riders killed increased from just over 4,200 to almost 4,462, an 11 percent increase. The number of motorcycle fatalities did fall between 2008 and 2009, the first time we have seen a decrease in more than a decade. We need to work to build on last year's progress. The most important step we could take would be to assure that all riders wear a DOT-compliant helmet, which are 37 percent effective in reducing fatalities. We estimate that helmets prevented over 1,800 fatalities in 2008, and that more than

800 additional fatalities could have been avoided if all riders wore helmets. NHTSA will actively work with Congress to promote helmet use".

A special thanks goes out to my dear friend, James Bonner, Hogansville, GA for accompanying me to the District Ride-Out. He wanted to see the changing colors in NY during the fall-we were a little earlier. But as his daughter said later, better than the brown and wilted they have been seeing in Georgia. So, thanks to everyone who welcomed James in the true GWRRA fashion. He enjoyed himself and met a lot of wonderful people along the way. Another special thanks goes to Leigh and Doug Yerdon for taking James and I on some wonderful rides including one to Vermont where we enjoyed some "real" Vermont ice cream. Yep, according to Doug, Friendly's in Rutland, VT uses "real" Vermont ice cream. So, now I can color in another state on my map. So, how you are probably wondering why I did not have an article in the October newsletter-I was darn pooped from all the riding and excitement to even think straight to compose an article. For pictures of the District Ride Out-Chapter N has them posted on their Facebook page.

I would strongly urge everyone to become acquainted with the members of Chapter X-they are a young and diversified group of people and are a welcomed addition to the New York District.
