Preparing for Winter Driving

As we progress from Fall to Winter, we need to switch gears and direct our attention to preparing ourselves and vehicles, four wheeled kind, for winter.

Starting off, never warm up your vehicle in an enclosed area. As we see in the news too often, carbon monoxide is a silent killer. Like your motorcycle, it is just as important to check your tire pressure. As the temperatures drop, so do our tire pressures. Never mix radial tires with other types of tires. Keep your fuel tank at least 1/2 full. If possible avoid using your emergency brake in cold, rainy, snowy weather. You may find that it can freeze up and not release properly. Keep up on your oil changes, replace your windshield wipers if they are leaving streaks, keep your windshield washer fluid topped off and lubricate your locks and hinges.

How old is your battery? Cold weather puts a drain on batteries. Have it checked periodically and replace if recommended. Have emergency items stowed in your vehicle like gloves, hats, blanket, road flares, snow shovel, a small bag of rock salt or kitty litter, nonperishable food items, and flash light with extra batteries. They will come in handy, should you become stuck. Be prepared for the worst.

Going on a trip? Watch the weather reports and forecasts. Bring along extra food, water and medications incase you become snow bound. Make sure your cellular phone is fully charged and you have all your emergency phone numbers. If you become snow bound stay with your vehicle. It provides you with shelter and it will be easier for rescuers to locate you. Don't walk out into the storm or over exert yourself. Attaching a bright colored item on your antenna or cloth rolled up into your window signals a car in distress. Make sure your exhaust pipe stays clear of ice and snow. A blocked exhaust pipe can back up carbon monoxide into your vehicle. If possible run your engine as little as possible, just enough to get the chill out. To help keep warm use whatever is available, such as newspaper and floor mats for extra insulation.

We live in an area where the snow can fly for the greater part of 5 months. Take the time to get your vehicle and yourself fitted for winter. P.S. Don't forget to grab your Gold Book off your bike before putting it away. It's always a great resource. As we say while riding, dress for the crash, in the winter dress to survive.

Steve Jobs fascinated me. He was such an entrepreneur who had the ability to look into the future, figure out what the world needed and then be able to bring it to market, sell it and make money. I believe all of us have been touched by his genius in some way or another whether it is the iPod, iMac, iPhone, etc. I read an article on Jobs' seven rules of success and I am listing them here because I found them quite interesting.

1. **Do what you love.** Jobs once said, "People with passion can change the world for the better." Asked about the advice he would offer would-be entrepreneurs, he said, "I'd get a job as a busboy or something until I figured out what I was really passionate about." That's how much it meant to him. Passion is everything.
2. **Put a dent in the universe.** Jobs believed in the power of vision. He once asked then-Pepsi President, John Sculley, "Do you want to spend your life selling sugar water or do you want to change the world?" Don't lose sight of the big vision.
3. **Make connections.** Jobs once said creativity is connecting things. He meant that people with a broad set of life experiences can often see things that others miss. He took

calligraphy classes that didn't have any practical use in his life – until he built the Macintosh. Jobs traveled to India and Asia. He studied design and hospitality. Don't live in a bubble. Connect ideas from different fields.

4. **Say no to 1,000 things.** Jobs was as proud of what Apple chose not to do as he was of what Apple did. When he returned to Apple 1997, he took a company with 350 products and reduced them to 10 products in a two-year period. Why? So he could put the “A-Team” on each product. What are you saying “no” to?
5. **Create insanely different experiences.** Jobs also sought innovation in the customer-service experience. When he first came up with the concept for the Apple Stores, he said they would be different because instead of just moving boxes, the stores would enrich lives. Everything about the experience you have when you walk into an Apple store is intended to enrich your life and to create an emotional connection between you and the Apple brand. What are you doing to enrich the lives of your customers?
6. **Master the message.** You can have the greatest idea in the world, but if you can't communicate your ideas, it doesn't matter. Jobs was the world's greatest corporate storyteller. Instead of simply delivering a presentation like most people do, he informed, he educated, he inspired and he entertained, all in one presentation.
7. **Sell dreams, not products.** Jobs captured our imagination because he really understood his customer. He knew that tablets would not capture our imaginations if they were too complicated. The result? One button on the front of an iPad. It's so simple, a 2-year old can use it. Your customers don't care about your product. They care about themselves, their hopes, their ambitions. Jobs taught us that if you help your customers reach their dreams, you'll win them over.

There's one story that I think sums up Jobs' career at Apple. An executive who had the job of reinventing the Disney Store once called up Jobs and asked for advice. His counsel? Dream bigger. I think that's the best advice he could leave us with. See genius in your craziness, believe in yourself, believe in your vision, and be constantly prepared to defend those ideas.

Who?

This is a question our Member Services Department hears quite frequently from Members. They have received their new Member or renewal packet, and tucked inside is a membership card for the co-rider with the word "Who" where the Member's name should appear.

When filling out the membership application, the applicant will often neglect to fill in the name of their co-rider. If Member Services cannot reach the applicant to verify the co-rider's name when processing the application, the card gets issued with the word "Who" in place of their name.

Often times, once the Member receives the "Who" card, they will call and request a new card with the co-rider's name, but as of July 2011 here in Region B we have 26 co-riders named "Who".

Because it can take up to two weeks to receive a replacement card, let's remind our Members, when renewing or applying for the first time, to fill in the co-rider's name. This will insure that the Co-rider receives a membership card with their name and not the dreaded "WHO"

Where are all the Co-Riders “Who” located here in Region B? Most everywhere, we don’t have a lot of them they most Districts have them. If you find them on your Chapter ARL Listing them you may want to bring this issue to the Member themselves so they can quickly have their Membership Card modified, once they know it’s only one phone call away for GWRRA Membership Services **800.843.9460**.

Here the Region rest assure we can answer most questions you may have on Membership or how to read your Area Report List. None of us the older generation was born “Cable Ready” If you are experiencing some issues on how to manipulate your monthly Membership Listing, things like copy , paste, format, search, filter, print, and lot more , just send us your questions and best time to reach you and will give you technical assistance.
