Hazards of LSD (Limited Sight Distant Hazards)

Back in 2010 when I was the Educator for Chapter D I wrote an article based on Ken Condon's Street Strategy Section, which you can find in Motorcycle Consumer News. The Street Strategy Section usually reviews everyday hazards motorcyclists deal with while riding. In this article, the motorcyclist is riding home from work on a twisty road with a limited number of straightaways. He is positioned in the left track, and coming towards him on a straight section of road is a large motorhome with a number of cars trailing behind.

When we are riding we should be scanning ahead of us looking for potential hazards. Reading what Ken Condon is describing we should anticipate the on coming traffic as a hazard. What could be the hazards? Could a car be hiding in a blind spot behind the motorhome? Another hazard might be a frustrated driver not thinking clearly, ready to pull at the most opportune time for him.

Once we recognize or anticipate a potential hazard we should be mentally solving the problem with prioritizing the most severe or hazardous problem first. Doing so will cut down the delay in responding to a problem should it occur. So what would our option be?

The Advance Riding Class (ARC) teaches us that we have 3 options. Adjust your speed, and/or direction, and/or communicate or a combination of these. Adjusting your direction can be as simple as changing from riding in the left track to the right track. By moving to the right track, it may give the person trailing behind the camper a better angle of view of you. The movement might even be enough to catch his or her attention of your presence. Be prepared to adjust your speed by covering the brakes, this could save the few fractions of seconds you may need to avoid an accident. Communicating may be as simple as sounding your horn to let someone know where you are. Using hand signals to augment your turn signals or waving someone into your lane who is trying to merge in.

Ken's rider sees a car swing out into his lane. The motorcyclist immediately starts flashing his lights and honking his horn to grab the attention of the motorist, to no avail. Seeing that the vehicle is still in his lane, the cyclist then starts applying his brakes. He moves off the road, onto the gravel shoulder and eventually ends up in a ditch. Ken points out that flashing your lights and honking your horn to grab the driver's attention did waste valuable seconds. Sure it is a way to communicate, but it wasted time that the rider needed to slow down and possibly put more distance between him and the car that is in his lane.

While Ken's rider is a fictitious rider, the scenario he describes can be very real. Remember limited sight distant is not limited to just a large motorhome blocking someone's view. We can find such perils in blind curves, coming over the crest of a hill, hidden driveways anything that is obstructing our view or the view of others. What is important is to always be on the look out. Scanning ahead, check those mirrors before pulling into another lane to know who or what is behind you, seek out those hazards, anticipate what may happen, and act when you need to.

“Don't Let Them Sit Alone”

As a Chapter Director the monthly Gathering is a very busy day for us. We are doing last minute things to make the Gathering successful; confirming items or answering questions of TEAM members; we want to say hello to each member and visitor that comes to the Gathering...we are busy! However there is one item we must immediately attend to and that is a new GWRRA member or potential member visiting our Chapter for the first time. This visitor is very important to GWRRA and to your Chapter...a future officer! They need to feel welcomed, special, have questions answered and to know that they matter to GWRRA and to your Chapter.



I understand that we all have times when we do not want to be social or we just want to be with our friends because we haven't seen them in a while, but as a GWRRA member, especially an Officer, you need to be proactive when it comes to first time visitors. Have a plan in place on how your Chapter will handle a first time visitor...be prepared for more than one at a time. Have a Welcome Packet prepared for them. As a Chapter Director we need to greet them but we cannot spend the entire time with them as we have other duties to take care of...so have a few friendly members sit with the visitor...never let them sit alone.

These trusted Chapter members need to let the guest know what the chapter does for FUN...where the chapter has ridden...answer questions about the Welcome Packet...why are people buying tickets (only if they ask)...why they choose to participate...why they love GWRRA. They need to get to know the visitor...what kind of bike do they have... where do they live...ask about their family. If you get the visitor to personally connect to more than one member you will more likely get them to return?

Note about the Welcome Packet: This packet is a quick way to be sure you get the information you want from and to the visitor. It has an information form they fill out and give to you so you have all their contact information, family members, birthdays, anniversary, what they ride, etc. It has information about the Rider Ed Levels Program along with the Level 1 application for them to fill out and if they are a member you can present them with the Level 1 patches that day and make them feel special! There is also the emergency medical information form for them to fill-out at their leisure and to put on their bike in the left side console unlocked case so if we need it the information is there. This shows the guest that you already care about them and their safety. You can also put in the Chapter Handbook that they can read later about the Chapter and how it functions.

Note about Ticket Sales: Please note that I said you tell them why people are buying tickets and only if they ask; but I did not say to sell them tickets. They are a guest...a first time visitor...treat them like one and do not ask them for money. Now if they ask and you explain what the ticket sales are for (it is how the Chapter gets its operating funds) and they ask if they can buy tickets that is different and of course they can buy them...you just should not ask them to spend money on their first visit.

So after the really FUN and informative Gathering is completed it is time for the Chapter Director to again go and visit with the guest. Thank them for visiting with the group, ask what they enjoyed about the Gathering and ask them to attend an upcoming ride. This does not mean that other members should not introduce themselves and thank them for visiting. Remember the more personal connections that can be made with the new member the more likely they will return. If they are not a member of GWRRA this is also the best time to ask them to consider joining as you hand them a membership application. Let them know they can do it online or you would be happy to send it in for them.

None of the things listed here are difficult to do but you do need to have a plan of action and to be prepared for your first time visitor. This first time visit is the most important opportunity the Chapter has to add a new Chapter participant to all the FUN you are having. Don't lose them and don't let them sit alone.

NEW YORK DISTRICT LEADERSHIP TRAINERS



Hello GWRRA Members! What a busy season we are all having. Are you taking seminars and presentations on Chapter Life, Life Skills and honing your riding skills? Oh! You have taken all those seminars and trainings. Did you know that we also have Intermediate and Advanced seminars in Leadership Training? Those seminars are just packed with interesting ways to help yourself, family and your fellow members. What a great feeling to know we have all these opportunities to teach and to learn.

Well the new program, University Training Development Program (UTDP) is well under way. In case you did not have an opportunity to check it out I thought you might want to know how it affects our Leadership Training Program (LTP). Our LTP is just incorporated into the UTDP.

The first step is to take the University Training Development Program by a Master University Trainer. A Master University Trainer is how one is “Certified” for each of the Divisions within GW University. The first time you teach in any of the GW University Divisions; Leadership Training, Riders Education and Membership Enhancement the Master observer is checking to see if you are practicing the skills learned in the University Training Development Program which can only be taught by a Master Trainer. When you continue onto other Divisions within the UTDP you are only being observed to be “Certified” in that division of the program. As you may know this University Training Development Program (UTDP) is relatively new and is being tweaked at this time. This program is similar to the Instructors Development Certification Program only now it incorporates Riders Education, Leadership Training and Membership Enhancement Training under one heading.

Taking the University Training Development Program (UTDP) is a program to prepare you for teaching the participants the many seminars and trainings offered by GWRRA. After this training you will be asked to fill out a form stating in which order in the GW University program (Rider Education, Leadership Training and Membership Enhancement) division choosing first choice, second choice and third choice. Please note you do not have to teach in all three divisions, this is optional. This is how you become certified in any one category and the steps to become a Certified Master Instructor. A member has the opportunity to advance in the UTDP program by completing a form stating what category you are interested in teaching. This form is how the NY District and Region Trainers have available to assist the new instructors to accomplish their certifications goals. The NY/NJ Bi-State Rally is one of many wonderful venues for new instructors to be certified. A Master Instructor will be on hand to observe you so that you can complete your certification in each division of the GW University program of your choosing.

I know it is a little confusing at first but as you continue to attend and familiarize yourself with the programs it will become clearer and as you become more involved you the members can understand what is being accomplished. There is a new University Handbook draft in the works. Is the handbook complete? No, but GWRRA and all the Master Instructors are working on it and before we know it, many details will be resolved.

So be sure and get involved so your voice can be heard on all important issues, this is your association and you want it to be fun and interesting for everyone not just one or two. There is someone at every level that is there to assist the members as they learn to share knowledge with their fellow members. Remember to think “team”. TEAM is very important, because a team accomplishes positive actions for a better tomorrow.

See you at the NY/NJ Bi-State Convention Rally. Please stop and say hello and tell us what you like about the Leadership Program, we are pushing for positive results.
